CLUB DEVELOPMENT MILESTONES

Over the last 83 years the members of St. Finian's GAA have responded when big developments in the club's journey were being made.

1943: St. Finian's GAA established in Newcastle.

1982 - 1984:	St. Finian's GAA purchases Aylmer Road grounds through club draw which sells 778 tickets at €100 each.
1997 - 2000:	The clubhouse is built through donations and volunteerism of the local community.
2006 - 2008:	The main pitch and floodlights are developed at the Aylmer Road grounds.
2022:	Our second pitch, Sandymark Park, located at Ballynakelly is opened

through the support of local businesses.

ST. FINIAN'S GAA TODAY

Today St. Finian's GAA club comprises of over 450 members. We field 22 teams starting from the "Mini Fins" at 4/5 years old. Those 22 teams are make use of our three current pitches; Aylmer Road Adult Pitch, Aylmer Road Juvenile Pitch and Sandymark Park Adult Pitch.





Consistently over the last five years the club has been forced to cancel trainings and matches because of a need to protect the pitches so that weekend games can take place. It is crucial for the development of young players and to ensure that no trainings or games are called off that we develop an all weather playing surface that will be used for decades to come.

THE FINIAN'S '300' WALL WILL RAISE €125,000.

The **FINIAN'S "300" WALL** will raise €125,000.. All of the fundraised money will be going towards the All Weather Astro pitch development. The wall will be creatively designed in conjunction with The Printed Image, a long time supporter of St. Finian's GAA.

THE INITIAL BREAKDOWN OF SPONSORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES IS;



The **FINIAN'S '300' WALL** will be positioned prominently beside the entrance to the synthetic pitch.

The location/position of Sponsor name's will be chosen at random by lottery within their level of sponsorship. The \in 5,000 sponsors will be in the top row, followed by the \in 2,000 sponsors below them and so on. Below you can see a mock up of how the Finian's '300' Wall will be laid out.

The **FINIAN'S '300' WALL** will be very large in size. The sign will be consistently maintained and repaired as necessary to keep it in fantastic condition for years to come.

*It may be the case that St. Finian's receive more than the targeted number of sponsorship placements. In this case the number at each level will be increased and encompassed in the design.








PROJECT OUTLINE

- The project will develop a 90m x 65m All Weather state of the art astro turf pitch at our Aylmer road grounds.
- The pitch would replace the current Juvenile Pitch. The All Weather playing surface would guarantee that teams will be able to play and train year round in our grounds.
- 3 The new pitch would involve re-orientating the current Juvenile Pitch and car park.
- The pitch would allow U8 to U12 teams to play their games without fear of cancellation due to weather.
 - The development of our club grounds would also see completion of our club walkway and would allow for more accessible parking closer to our Adult Pitch.

Tax Back Donation

We have successfully registered for the Revenue Approved Scheme on donations to support capital projects such as is proposed. Under the Capital Donations Scheme a donation from aPAYE taxpayer is enhanced by an additional payment which the club receive directly from Revenue.

Alternatively, if you are a self-assessed/self-employed taxpayer you can claim a tax deduction for the donation that you make to the club under the scheme.

Each individual who donates will be asked to complete a revenue certificate which will allow an additional 25% to 50% of money to come to the club from Revenue. For donations of €250 that means at least extra €62.50 to the club. For donations of €1,000 that means at least an extra €300 to the club.
